





Respect for Staff

Wagner School believes strongly, that a positive relationship between staff and students is essential to learning.

- Students must take responsibility for their actions.
- Students must recognize that it is the staff's duty to represent the interests of the school as well as promoting the safety and well-being of all students.
- Students deserve to have their side of the story heard but, in return, must listen to other students, teachers and supervisors when opposing viewpoints are presented.
- Students are expected to respond appropriately when a request is made of them by an adult.

Respect for the School

It is essential that students take pride in their school; the appearance of the building is a reflection of this pride.

- Games that could cause damage to the school must be played at a safe distance from the school.
- Any actions that damage school property and vandalism within the school itself are forbidden.
- Students are encouraged to take an active role in keeping the classroom and hallways clean and attractive.

Respect for Academic Preparation

Wagner School is dedicated to helping students form habits that will be essential to their future success:

- Students are expected to be on time.
- Students are expected to do homework when required by the teacher.

- Students should make sure that their day to day work is organized, neat and complete. Students should form the habit of studying for exams and tests.
- Students are encouraged to read on their own and add to the classroom with their own experience with learning.
- Students and teachers are encouraged to involve parents in learning through homework help and involvement in the classroom whenever possible.

Respect for Other Students

Wagner School is dedicated to creating strong and healthy relationships between students.

- Students should try to treat others in the school with the same respect they wish for themselves.
- Students should recognize the difference between telling on other students to get them in trouble and seeking out a teacher to help solve a problem or resolve a particularly dangerous situation. Tattling is discouraged. Seeking out staff to help resolve situations for the benefit of all students is encouraged.
- While the staff believes that inclusion of all students in activities is a worthy goal and that exclusion from activities by staff or students is rarely beneficial, it also obligates the students to play cooperatively and with a sense of fairness towards other students.
- The students should use appropriate language and tone of voice when addressing other students and should refrain from taunting or teasing other students.

Safety - page 1



For the safety of our students and staff, our doors will be locked after 9:05am, each day. Our students are encouraged to use the front door for emergency reasons, at recess. All staff members can easily access the doors, during recess times, with keys. Students arriving late to school as well as any visitors will utilize the doorbell/video system to be given access to the school.

Safety

- Students coming to school on bicycles should ride slowly on school grounds and proceed directly to the bike racks 2nd St. West entrance.
- During the school day, riding bicycles, scooters, skateboards or using rollerblades is forbidden.
- Bullying in all its forms (physical, verbal or intimidation) is forbidden.
- Body contact games on the playground are forbidden, as well as, rough play in non-contact games.
- Students are not allowed to play on the bus road or parking lot.
- Bus line-ups should be orderly and students should be prepared to board the bus when it arrives.
- Students leaving the school grounds at noon must have communicated parent permission and proceed directly to their destination.

Student Accident Insurance

The Board of Education entered into an agreement with Marsh and McLennan to obtain student accident insurance. The cost is covered by the school division. This insurance covers students under the following circumstances: (a) injury occurring in or on school buildings or premises by reason of attending classes on a regular school day; (b) injury occurring while in attendance at or participating in any school activity approved and supervised by proper school authority.

Physical Education Safety Guidelines


All students are expected to have a pair of running shoes in good condition to safely participate in Physical Education. Water bottles are also recommended.

Bikes/Blades/Scooters/Skateboards

Racks are provided for bicycle storage. Students are encouraged to lock up their bicycles and to get them stamped by the Oasis Centre. This free service helps to identify stolen bicycles · Wagner School is not responsible for stolen bicycles. Students riding scooters, rollerblades or skateboards to school are expected to keep their skateboards and scooters inside for the duration of the school day. Again, the school is not responsible for lost or stolen skateboards or scooters.

Lunch Policy

If students are staying for lunch, they are to eat their lunches in their classrooms and in their own desks from 12:20 – 12:40 p.m. If students have finished their lunch at 12:35, they may go outside early when advised by a supervisor. Students are expected to follow basic lunchroom rules and, if they do not follow the rules, they will be given a warning. If a second offense occurs, the parents will be contacted and informed. Lunch privileges may be removed. On the third offense, parents will be contacted and lunch privileges will be removed for a period of time determined by the principal and lunch supervisors. Students who normally eat lunch at school and who wish to leave the schoolyard, are required to bring a note from their parent or guardian indicating they have permission to do so.

Medication Policy (prescription/counter drugs)

Parents or guardians are encouraged to administer medications at home and during school hours. If this is not possible, you are required to complete a Medication Permission Form (available at the office) and provide it to the school before any medications can be administered by employees of the Board.

School Trip Policy

Field trips are planned to provide both educational and recreational opportunities for our students. While these trips follow curriculum outcomes, they are also a privilege. Students earn the right to take advantage of these trips by displaying acceptable behaviour and by working conscientiously throughout the year. Students who do not meet these expectations may not be allowed to take part in the trips or parents may be asked to come along.



Student Personal Electronic Devices

In adherence to the Saskatchewan Government and NESD guidelines, students at Wagner school may not use PEDs during the school day, including breaks/recess. It is strongly encouraged that students leave all PED's (including cell phones) at home. If PEDs are brought to school, they will no be readily accessible during school hours. Students may use the school phone to communicate with their parents/guardians if they are unwell or if there is an emergency.

Music Devices and other electronics Usage


We encourage students to leave these at home. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen devices. Students cannot use these during school time or at recesses.



Dress and Appearance

Students are expected to have an appearance that is reasonable, modest, decent and respectable. They are encouraged to dress in clothing suitable for an elementary school, the weather, and the education program. Outdoor clothing should not be worn in the classroom. Caps, hats, and toques are to be removed once students and adults are in the school. Students must have inside footwear. Runners with non-marking soles are required to be worn in the gym. Due to health and safety reasons, **No bare feet will be permitted**



If you know that your child will be absent from school, please enter the absence into Edsby.





Guiding Steps: Setting Up and Changing Notifications for the Web Version

Step 1: Turning on Notifications

When first logging in to Edsby, all accounts will be prompted with the option to turn Notifications on for the account. Please select Turn on Notifications.



By turning these on, teachers and parents will be notified of:

- Replies and Likes on your posts (Both Groups and Classes)
- Grades commented on
- Upcoming Assessments (assignments, projects, tests, etc.)
- Class Calendar Reminder
- Digest daily summary of activity





Guiding Steps: Setting Up and Changing Notifications for the Web Version

Step 1: On your home screen select "Settings" > "Notifications"





Step 2: Begin customizing your notifications by selecting one of the following that may be available:

- 1. Messages
- 2. Activity Digest
- Personal Calendar
- 4. Organization (School)
- 5. Children
- 6. Groups (if any)





How to Manage Notifications - Mobile App



Step 3: Choose the type(s) of notifications you prefer for each of the categories listed above. The options will be Edsby, Email, or Mobile.



Note: These notifications can be updated and changed at any time.



Viewing Your Student's Report Card



Background: NESD is continually moving towards publishing student report cards in an electronic manner. With Edsby, parents can view their student's report card in the web version or on the Edsby App.

Guiding Steps: Web Version

Step 1: Login to Edsby using a web browser - nesd.edsby.com

Step 2: Select the "View Report Cards" link on the Classes panel for the student. This will open the student's most recent Report Card.



Once a student has multiple report cards, parents can navigate to their child's Report Cards from all years in which they have been published online.

Step 3: Click the drop-down arrow at the top right corner of the Report Card to reveal a list of previously published reports.

Guiding Steps: Edsby App

Step 1: Login to Edsby App (remember to use NESD as the server)

Step 2: From the homepage select the Classes tile.



Step 3: Scroll to the very bottom of the Classes page and select View Report Cards.



Step 3: To view previously published reports select from the drop-down on the top-right of your screen.
