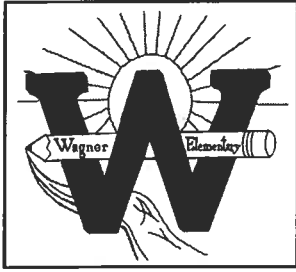

- 3. Sustainability (ex class sizes)
 - Everyone wants the small class sizes. NESD averages are low – 17 but based on #students/#staff
- 6. Our School Student Survey
 1. Student responses
 - In package
 - Participation in sport – low due to Covid for instance
 - Grade 6's are lower than average in sense of belonging and were in Grade 4 in belonging (compared to similar demographics)
 - Hours on computer and using a phone is higher
 - Our behaviour has been positive this year.
 - Grade 6's high anxiety and did in Gr 4
 - Intense physical activity
 - Bullying is fairly low yet not feeling safe
 - Is it Covid related?
 - We work hard on Teacher/student relations – too bad to see Gr 6 don't feel that way
 - 30% indigenous seems low – we thing 37 – 40 but this is self declaring
 - Discussion of Bullying
 - We are seeing some cyber bullying, mostly recess and after school and mostly outside of school.
 - How bullying is handles and working on, by-standard reaction
 - Discussion of Safety at school
 - Kids reporting seeing kids getting hurt but teachers aren't seeing that
 2. Open ended Questions
 - Not put as much focus on the “complaining” and more on those who are feeling safe
- 7. Babysitting Course
 - Red Cross – in Yorkton = the could run a course if we get 13-20 kids, could we support this 11 years and finished grade 5 and up to 14. Maybe a couple of groups.
 - Alanna will create an invite and then Trevor will advertise as an SCC event. Other activities we announce and put on Facebook but don't push it.
