Universal Expectation: Safety in the Hallway

Name of Skill/Setting: Being Safe in our Hallways

Purpose of the Lesson

1. Encourage students to walk in the hallway, on the proper side. (This is usually done during class but not during unstructured time)
2. Be careful to avoid others coming out of doorways or in the halls

Teaching Examples

1. A student is excited to go outside and play ditch so they get their coat and run down the hall to get outside.
2. They are really thirsty and want to get a drink before the bell rings.
3. A student forgot something in the gym and you want to hurry to get it before someone else takes it.

Student Activities and Role Plays

1. Discuss other examples why students might be unsafe in the hallways (running, laying on the floor, walking on the left, cutting corners).
2. Discuss safety with a student or adult coming out of a classroom door or around the corner.
3. Walk around the hallways, keeping to the right side of the hall. This is usually done during class but rarely done during unstructured time.

Follow up/Reinforcement Activity

1. Recognize students who do this during breaks and thank them
2. Verbally praise
3. Students that do not do this regularly can be a monitor for a short period of time in the hallway.
